



Top Legislative Advocacy Campaigns

Prevent Disproportional Health Care Cost Increases

The administration's FY2018 budget request includes large increases to TRICARE fees across the board. These fee increases are a direct result of the repeal of the 2017 National Defense Authorizations grand-fathering clause. The intention of the grand-fathering was to keep fees where they currently are for beneficiaries in the service prior to January 1, 2018. These fee increases are disproportional and do not reflect the service and sacrifice of the beneficiaries who have earned the health care benefit. Please send your legislators this AFSA suggested message to prevent these hefty fee increases from negatively impacting service members and their families.

Uniformed Service Members Deserve a Full Pay Raise

In an August 31 letter to House and Senate leaders, President Trump formally notified Congress he intends to set the 2018 military pay raise at 2.1 percent. While this matches last year's raise, it falls short of the 2.4 percent pay raise allowable under current law. A number of "modest reductions" in pay over the past few years have created a growing pay gap between the uniformed services and their civilian counterparts. Left unchecked, this gap will grow to 2.9 percent.

Stop Senate Proposal to Slash Housing Allowances for Dual-Military Couples

Section 603 of the Senate Armed Services Committee's FY 2018 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), S. 1519, includes a provision that would cut BAH for dual-military couples to the "without dependents rate" even if they have children. In effect, a service member married to another service member with children would lose hundreds of dollars each month.

Support "The Military Patron Protection Act" (H.R. 2850)

A lot of changes are taking place to our commissaries and exchanges. That's why we are fighting to increase transparency and oversight of how the Department of Defense (DoD) manages our commissary and exchange contributions.

Congressman Walter Jones (R-NC) and Tim Walz (DFL-MN) are leading the fight with the introduction of a bipartisan bill aimed at safeguarding valuable military family support programs including the commissary and exchange benefit. H.R. 2850, "The Military Patron Protect Act", would provide commissary and exchange patrons, like yourself, with a voice in how DoD manages the earnings generated by your patronage of these programs.

Action Alert for H.R. 846, Repeal the SBP-DIC Offset

Our AFSA legislative team needs your help in honoring military spouses and survivors. When they retire, military members often invest in the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP), paying into it each month. Once they die, their survivors receive a monthly SBP annuity from DoD. However, if that retiree was disabled as a result of military service, their survivor may also be eligible for dependency and indemnity compensations (DIC) from the VA. Under current law, DoD is allowed to implement a dollar-for-dollar reduction in SBP payments to a survivor, if that survivor is also receiving DIC.

S. 66, the "Retired Pay Restoration Act",

Due to legislation achieved over the years by AFSA and our Coalition partners, military retirees with a service-connected disability of at least 50 percent (as rated by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)) are able to concurrently receive all of their military retirement pay and all of their VA disability compensation without offset.
